"HOW ARE YOU?" "I'M FINE." Typical North American greeting, wouldn't you say? Recently, we were reminded of a possible interpretation of that in the form of an acrostic: Feelings Inside Not Expressed!

② Ain't it the truth!!! Oh, to have 'safe' people in our lives who want to explore with discernment and compassion our "FINE" responses!

We recently read this great little book entitled, <u>Them, the Richer Life in Caring for Others</u>, by John Certalic. We highly recommend this read in that God has called **all** of us to be "care-givers." One of the most basic and difficult practices he encourages in the book is that of truly **LISTENING** to another. When we resist the urge to "fix," we will listen to "understand" more than to "be understood."

The author suggests that we need remember only two questions when we want to inquire into the life of another that will honor the person. The **first** is one we ask ourselves, "WHAT MUST IT BE LIKE TO BE THAT PERSON?" Then other questions will naturally flow from that, like: "What's the worst part of it for you? And, "How are your friends and relatives responding to you? Or, "Where is God in all of this for you?" The **second** question we can ask is pretty simple. It's a follow up question that most of our grandchildren have down well…"WHY?" or "WHAT DO YOU MEAN BY THAT?" or "CAN YOU GIVE ME AN EXAMPLE OF THAT?"

These are just a few thoughts from this book that may encourage and challenge you as they have us. Please pray that we will be those kind of listeners to our missionaries!!!

On another note, the Lord has clarified our Fall plans. For two weeks in October we will invade North Carolina to attend a "Pastors to Missionaries Conference" and to connect face-to-face with five other ACTION couples who will be in the state at the same time!
